

Review Questions to be used with Lesson 5

1. How was life in the garden different from the life Cain and Abel knew? *(There was no hard work; no weeds; no illnesses or death; God walked and talked with Adam and Eve there.)*
2. Why couldn't Adam and Eve live in the garden anymore? *(They had sinned.)*
3. What is sin? *(Wanting your way instead of God's way.)*
4. What are some sins kids your age might do? *(Answers may vary.)*
5. What offerings did Cain and Abel bring to God? *(Cain brought fruits and vegetables; Abel brought a lamb.)*
6. How did God feel about their offerings? *(He was pleased with Abel's offering but not with Cain's.)*
7. How did God show His love to Cain? *(He gave him another chance to bring the right kind of offering; he placed a mark of protection on him.)*
8. What did Cain do after God rejected his offering? *(He became jealous of Abel, hated him and killed him.)*
9. What was Cain's punishment? *(He would be unable to grow good crops and become a wanderer with no home.)*
10. Why did Jesus die? *(To take the punishment you deserve for sin; as the final sacrifice for sin.)*
11. How can you have your sins forgiven and have everlasting life? *(Believe in Jesus.)*
12. What is one way you can show your faith? *(By obeying God; answers may vary.)*

Cain and Abel Relay Lesson 5

Provide a set of pictures for each team.

Write the following phrases on craft sticks or pieces of paper, and place them in a large bowl.

Cain Clues:

1. Adam and Eve's first born
2. First baby ever born
3. Was a farmer
4. God did not accept his offering
5. Wanted his own way
6. Became very angry at God
7. God showed him mercy
8. He turned away from God

Abel Clues:

1. Adam and Eve's second born
2. Brought his offering to God by faith
3. Was a shepherd
4. God accepted his offering
5. Wanted God's way
6. He was murdered by his brother
7. He loved God
8. He obeyed God

Divide your children up into two teams and place the bowl with the craft sticks in the middle of the two teams just before the starting line.

Place cups and the pictures of Cain and Abel at the opposite end of the room across from each team. Place a cup in front of each picture. Children take turns picking up a craft stick, reading it, (or having it read to them by a small group leader if unable to read) and then running to the other side of the room, and dropping the craft stick in the appropriate cup. When the bowl is empty the game is over. The team that has the most correct craft sticks in the cups wins.
