

Review Questions to use with Lesson 1

1. How did God show mercy to you and me? *(By sending Jesus to take the punishment for our sins by dying on the cross and rising again.)*
2. What is one way the Bible helps you grow? *(Teaching you more about who God is, correcting when you sin, and helping you live rightly.)*
3. When God's Word says you will have everlasting life if you believe in Jesus, what does that mean? *(Your sin will be forgiven and you will be close to God here on Earth and live with Him in Heaven someday.)*
4. What materials or supplies did God need to create the heaven and the Earth? *(Nothing.)*
5. How can you have a relationship with God? *(By trusting the Lord Jesus to forgive your sin.)*
6. Why did God create all the wonders of the universe? *(So people would see them and know and worship God.)*
7. What was the most wonderful gift God gave to Adam and Eve? *(A close relationship with Himself.)*
8. What was Adam's job in the garden? *(To name the animals and take care of the garden.)*
9. Why is sin serious to God? *(It separates us from Him.)*
10. What is one way you can show your faith? *(By obeying God; answers may vary.)*
11. How did God show His love to Cain? *(He gave him another chance to bring the right kind of offering; he placed a mark of protection on him.)*
12. Who is the only one who had no beginning? *(God.)*

Creator King Relay

We just finished a series of lessons about God being the Creator and King of everything. (See if the children can tell you about the lessons from the God the Creator King series.) Let's play a fun relay about Our mighty God, the Creator and King.

1. Group students into two teams. Teams line up by the starting. At the finish line there should be a crown that would fit on the child's head and a large piece of drawing paper and markers or crayons.
2. At your signal, the first student on each team runs down, puts the crown on and quickly draws a picture of something Jesus created. When the leader for their team (who should be at the finish line) identifies the drawing and says yes the child runs back and tags the next student in line. Play continues until the last person on each team has finished the race.
