

## (Review questions to use with Lesson 2)

1. Who told people the Redeemer would come? (*God; the prophets.*)
2. What does it mean that Jesus is the Redeemer? (*The Savior; the one who can save you from your sin.*)
3. What does the Bible call the twelve men who followed Jesus and learned from Him while He was on Earth? (*His disciples.*)
4. Who told Jesus about the problem at the wedding? (*His mother; Mary.*)
5. What did Jesus tell the servants to do with the large jars? (*Fill them with water.*)
6. What was Jesus showing about Himself when He used ordinary water to make wine? (*He is the almighty God who has power over everything.*)
7. What special book tells us many ways God shows His power? (*The Bible; God's Word.*)
8. After Jesus died on the cross, how did He prove He is almighty God? (*He came alive again.*)
9. What did the disciples think when they saw what Jesus did at the wedding? (*They were amazed; they believed in Him.*)
10. What does our memory verse say you must do to have everlasting life? (*Believe in Jesus.*)
11. If you have believed in Jesus as your Savior, what does it mean to you that Jesus is almighty? (*Answers will vary; He can help you with anything, etc.*)
12. If you have believed in Jesus as your Savior, what is something you can thank Him for? (*Answers will vary; family, friends, salvation, etc.*)

## The Great Grape Relay

Last week, we learned about the first miracle that Jesus did. What was it? (Turning water into wine) Do you know what is used to make wine? (Grapes) We are going to play a game with grapes.

### Directions:

1. Form two teams; each with an equal number of children.
2. For each team, place one bowl of grapes with a plastic spoon at the starting line and one empty bowl at the finish line. (making 4 bowls total)
3. On your signal, the first child in each line picks up one grape and places it on his or her spoon. The child then runs down and pours the grape into their team's empty bowl. The child runs back and tags the next person who will do the same thing.
4. The first team to complete the race wins.
5. If a child drops a grape, he or she must pick it up and continue to run with it.
