

## Lesson 2: (Review Questions from Lesson 1)

**You will use the questions below to form teams. Ask a question and the child that answers chooses a friend to start forming the first team. Keep asking questions until two equal teams are formed.**

1. Why could John testify (show) that Jesus is true and real? (*Because he knew Jesus personally.*)
2. Who would the Messiah be? (*The special one sent by God to save the Israelites and be their king.*)
3. What is the worst part about sin? (*It keeps you from having a relationship with God.*)
4. Why did God send the Messiah? (*To make a way for every person to be saved from the punishment for sin.*)
5. What is a message from God written in the past about something that would happen in the future? (*Prophecy.*)
6. What did the people shout as Jesus rode the donkey into Jerusalem? (*"Hosanna to the Son of David!"*)
7. Who is the only one who can set you free from the punishment of your sin? (*Jesus.*)
8. Why were the Pharisees not happy that Jesus had come to Jerusalem? (*They did not believe Jesus was sent by God.*)
9. How did Jesus show God's love for you? (*By dying to save you from your sin.*)
10. Today we learned about three prophecies that came true in Jesus. Can you name two of them? (*Born in Bethlehem; rode into Jerusalem on a colt; healed the sick.*)
11. What happens when you believe on Jesus? (*You are saved—forgiven of your sin and no longer separated from God.*)
12. If you have believed on Jesus as your Savior, when a friend asks how you know what you believe is true, what would you say? (*Answers will vary; Show them the promises God made and how they came true in Jesus.*)

## Memory Verse Basketball

Write each word of your memory verse (1 John 4:14) onto a post-it note, then stick the post-it note onto a larger piece of paper and wad it up into a mini-basketball. Make enough so that each team has their own set of memory verse "basketballs".

Divide your class into teams and place a child-sized basketball hoop (can also use a wastebasket or some other type of basket) for each team, approximately 5 feet from the finish line. (You can vary the distance depending on the age of the children.) Have first child on each team run to the finish line, pick up one mini-basketball and try to make a basket. Then run back and tag the next person in line. When all the balls are in the basket, the last person should run the basket back to the starting line and the team should open the basketballs to reveal all the words from the memory verse. First team to complete their memory verse and place it in the correct order wins.
