

Lesson 6: (Review Questions from all 5 Lessons)

Choose questions from here to play “Eye Spy Without My Eye”; “Super Secret Silent Seat”; “Race to Spy”)

Lesson 1:

1. Why could John testify (show) that Jesus is true and real? (*Because he knew Jesus personally.*)
2. Who would the Messiah be? (*The special one sent by God to save the Israelites and be their king.*)
3. What is the worst part about sin? (*It keeps you from having a relationship with God.*)
4. Why did God send the Messiah? (*To make a way for every person to be saved from the punishment for sin.*)
5. What is a message from God written in the past about something that would happen in the future? (*Prophecy.*)
6. What did the people shout as Jesus rode the donkey into Jerusalem? (*“Hosanna to the Son of David!”*)
7. Who is the only one who can set you free from the punishment of your sin? (*Jesus.*)
8. Why were the Pharisees not happy that Jesus had come to Jerusalem? (*They did not believe Jesus was sent by God.*)
9. How did Jesus show God’s love for you? (*By dying to save you from your sin.*)
10. Today we learned about three prophecies that came true in Jesus. Can you name two of them? (*Born in Bethlehem; rode into Jerusalem on a colt; healed the sick.*)
11. What happens when you believe on Jesus? (*You are saved—forgiven of your sin and no longer separated from God.*)
12. If you have believed on Jesus as your Savior, when a friend asks how you know what you believe is true, what would you say? (*Answers will vary; show them the promises God made and how they came true in Jesus.*)

Lesson 2:

1. According to 1 John 4:14, why did God the Father send His Son, Jesus, to the world? (*To be the Savior of the world.*)
2. What special celebration had the people come to Jerusalem for? (*Passover.*)
3. How did Passover begin? (*When the Israelites were slaves in Egypt, God told them to put blood on the doorposts of their house. God passed over the houses with the blood on the doorposts.*)
4. Why were the chief priests, elders and leaders at the temple making plans to kill Jesus? (*They rejected Jesus as the promised Savior.*)
5. What does sin separate you from? (*Having a friendship with God.*)
6. What prophecy did Judas play a part in fulfilling? (*Jesus would be betrayed for 30 pieces of silver.*)
7. What does it mean that God is omniscient? (*He knows everything.*)
8. How did Jesus know Judas would be the one to betray Him? (*He is God; He is omniscient.*)
9. What does the Lord’s Supper remind us of? (*Jesus’ sacrifice.*)
10. What did Jesus do for you so you could be saved from the punishment of sin? (*Gave His life’s blood; died on the cross.*)
11. When Jesus was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, what did He tell God the Father? (*He wanted the Father’s will to be done.*)
12. What does it mean to meditate on God’s Word? (*Thinking about and reminding yourself of the true things in the Bible.*)

Lesson 3:

1. Why did Jesus suffer in your place? (*Because He loves you.*)
2. Why could the religious leaders not find anything wrong with Jesus? (*He was innocent.*)
3. Why are sins people can't see still serious? (*God knows about them.*)
4. Why did Jesus remain silent when the leaders falsely accused Him? (*Jesus was trusting God; He knew it was part of God's plan to bring salvation to the world.*)
5. Why did the religious leaders decide to have Jesus killed? (*He said He was God.*)
6. What did Peter tell the three people who asked if he knew Jesus? (*He told them he didn't know Jesus.*)
7. Who did Pilate send Jesus to after he questioned Him? (*Herod.*)
8. Why did Pilate send Jesus away to be crucified? (*The people and religious leaders chose to release Barabbas; Pilate couldn't change the leaders' minds.*)
9. Why was Jesus the only one who could die for sinners? (*He is the only one who is just.*)
10. What does it mean that Jesus is just? (*He always does what is completely right.*)
11. What does it mean to believe in Jesus? (*Trust completely in Him and what He did for you.*)
12. If you have believed in Jesus as your Savior, what can separate you from the love of God? (*Nothing.*)

Lesson 4:

1. How were the men crucified with Jesus different than Jesus? (*They deserved to be punished but Jesus didn't.*)
2. Are you like the two men or like Jesus? Why? (*The two men; you deserve to be punished for your sin.*)
3. How does the Old Testament show that Jesus is the promised Savior? (*There are many details given in the Old Testament about the Messiah's death.*)
4. As Jesus hung on the cross, what did He ask God to do for the people? (*Forgive them.*)
5. What can you do to cause God to love you more or less? (*Nothing.*)
6. What did the two thieves on either side of Jesus think of Him? (*One made fun of Him and the other believed Jesus is the promised Savior.*)
7. What happened during the three hours of darkness as Jesus hung on the cross? (*Jesus carried the sins of the world; Jesus was separated from the Father; Jesus suffered God's anger and wrath against sin; He said "It is finished" and died.*)
8. When people sacrificed a lamb what was it supposed to remind them of? (*One day God would send someone who would take away sin once and for all.*)
9. What does the torn temple veil mean for you if you have believed in Jesus as your Savior? (*The way to God is open; it is possible for you to know God and talk with Him anytime.*)
10. Why did the religious leaders want to seal and guard the tomb where Jesus was buried? (*They didn't want Jesus' disciples to steal the body and convince people that Jesus was alive.*)
11. What does it mean when you call on the Lord Jesus to be saved? (*You are believing that you have sinned and that He took the punishment for your sins.*)
12. Why did Jesus die such a terrible death for you? (*To make a way for you to come to God instead of being separated from Him.*)

Lesson 5:


1. What surprised Mary Magdalene and the other women when they went to the tomb? (*The tomb was empty.*)
2. Who were the two people traveling to Emmaus? (*Two of Jesus' followers.*)
3. What did many of Jesus' followers think He came to do? (*They thought He would rescue their country from the Romans and lead Israel to be a great nation.*)
4. What are some things that could happen that might cause you to doubt what you believe? (*Answers will vary.*)

5. As they walked, what did Jesus help the two followers understand? (*The prophecies about Jesus. He explained that everything that happened was part of God's plan.*)
6. What is the only way people can have a right relationship with God? (*Through Jesus, God the Son, who came from Heaven to Earth to take the punishment for the sins of the world.*)
7. When the two followers realized the man was Jesus, what did they do? (*Went back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples.*)
8. If you have believed in Jesus as your Savior, how can God help you when things don't make sense? (*He can help you understand.*)
9. Before Jesus went back to Heaven, what did He command His disciples to do? (*Go into all the world, telling people the Good News.*)
10. What are two of the five R's to help you remember what to do when you don't understand why certain things happen? (*Remember you belong to Jesus; read God's Word and ask Him to help you understand; remember special promises from the Bible; rely on God; rejoice for what God has done for you in the past.*)
11. What does it mean to believe in Jesus? (*Trust completely in what Jesus did for you by dying for your sin and coming back to life.*)
12. According to John 20:31, why are things about Jesus written in the Bible? (*So anyone who reads it will believe that Jesus is God the Son.*)

He's Alive! Relay

Preparation

Cut brown paper or paper bags into rock shapes, creating one "rock" per team (approximately every four to six students.) Place paper rocks on one side of the playing area. Place a black marker next to each paper rock.



Lead the Game

1. Last week, we found out about two men who Jesus revealed Himself to. They found out He was alive from the dead. If you have trusted in Jesus, God wants you to tell others the good news about Jesus being our Savior.
2. What are some things we can say to share the good news about Jesus? ("Jesus is alive!" "Jesus saves!" "Jesus loves you" "We all have sinned!" "Jesus died for your sins.")
3. Group students into teams of four to six, creating at least two teams. Teams line up across the playing area from the paper rocks. At your signal, the first student from each team runs to his or her team's paper rock, says or writes one phrase on the rock, calls out the phrase and returns to his or her line, tagging the next student, who repeats the action. (Optional: Student sticks Post-it Note phrase on rock.) Relay continues until all students have had a turn. Repeat relay as time permits.

Discussion Questions

1. What does Jesus' death and resurrection mean for us? (Our sins can be forgiven when we believe in His death and resurrection. Jesus has the power to forgive our sins.)
2. What do you want to do when you hear the good news about eternal life through Jesus' death and resurrection? (Tell others. Thank God. Celebrate.)
3. With whom can you share this good news?
