What do you want the children to leave your club knowing?

Scripture Exodus 12:1-28; Zechariah 11:12; Matthew 26:1-5, 14-50; Luke 22:39-46

Memory Verse “And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Savior of the world.” (1 John 4:14)

Teaching Objective: The unsaved child will know and believe that Jesus willingly came to take the punishment for sins, fulfilling prophecy.

Main Teaching Jesus willingly offered Himself as your sacrifice for sin.

Emphasis for Saved: Take time to remember what Jesus has done for you.

Word Up! Jesus came to save me!

Small Group Leader – “Wonderful Things” Activity (What is your favorite thing about Jesus? Draw a picture of something Jesus has done or something you think is wonderful about Him. *(As the children draw, discuss the importance of taking time to think about and thank Jesus for who He is and what He has done. Ask them to share about what they drew and why.)* It is good to take time to think about Jesus and how wonderful it is that He was willing to die for our sins.)

Ideas to be used all year

_____ Q & A: What does the word “sacrifice” mean? In the Old Testament, God required His people (the Israelites) to sacrifice or give up by killing a perfect animal to pay for their sins. After Jesus came and died on the cross, the Bible says once for all, He paid the price of our sins. Our verse last week tells us this (quote 1 John 4:14) God the Father, sent God the Son to pay for all the sins that you have or will ever commit, past, present and future. The word sacrifice means to give up (one thing) for another thing considered to be of greater value. God took your punishment for your sins because He considers you of great value. He loves you and made you in His image. Will you receive the sacrifice He made by believing that you are a sinner and Christ died and sacrificed Himself to pay for your sin. Jesus came alive again to show that His payment for your sin was done, once for all. **Sing one chorus of “Let Me Listen”**

☞ _____ Highlight one student by fingerprinting their thumb (use ink pad, sticky note and wet wipe). The child will hold up the fingerprint and tell one way they think they are unique or different.

☞ _____ Rules, Consequences – By now the children should be able to tell you the rules without you telling them.

_____ Word Up: Jesus Came to Save Me! (Use IPEAR for the Word up)

Make sure you ask the review questions from the week before to form teams to play the relay. This helps you know if the children are grasping the truths you are desiring to teach.

Introduction: Stick your tongue out if you have ever been in trouble or danger and someone helped you out. (Allow several children to share about this experience.) Did you know we are all born in danger?

Presentation: Our Word up today tells us how we can be helped out of this danger. (Show the visual for the word up. Ask children to say it with enthusiasm)

Explanation: Can anyone tell me what danger we are born in? (Because of our sin we are born an enemy of God, separated from God) God loves you! Because He loves you, He sent His only Son, Jesus, to die on the cross. Jesus came because He loves you! He came for you so you could have a chance to believe in Him as your Savior. He didn't have to die on the cross but for you He did.

Application: Saved: If you have trusted in Jesus as your Savior, you know Jesus saved you from the punishment and power of sin. He has forgiven you of all sin. God wants you to talk to Him each day in pray and He wants to talk to you through His Word. Because of the **Word up: Jesus Came to Save Me!** you can be close to Him all the time. Spend time with Him throughout your day.

Unsaved: If you have not trusted in Jesus as your Savior, please know that God loves you and **Word up: Jesus Came to Save Me!** Listen to the Bible and you can be saved today.

_____ Prayer: Have any children that would like to thank Jesus for something including Him dying on the cross pat themselves on the stomach. Call on these children to pray out loud while the rest silently pray.

_____ Action Song: Jesus is the Good News! After singing the song with actions, ask the children “What is Jesus the way to?” (Allow responses) The way to Heaven

_____ **Memory Verse – (KJV) “And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Savior of the world.” (1 John 4:14)**
(ESV) “And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world.”
